# A VISION OF HOPE

# **DIRECTOR'S ADDRESS**

"Look! God's dwelling place is now among the people, and he will dwell with them. They will be his people, and God himself will be with them and be their God. 'He will wipe every tear from their eyes. There will be no more death' or mourning or crying or pain, for the old order of things has passed away." - Rev 21:3-4 (NIV)

At the end of each program year in April, our gap year students complete an assignment that responds to the vision of the New Creation presented in Revelation 21. They do this as a culmination of their walk through the biblical story and their journey through our program over the previous 7 months.

As Dr. Rikk Watts shared in my New Testament class when I was a grad student, "We are eschatological people". What he meant was that our vision of where the Big Story of God is going shapes how we live out our days. We are meant to be people shaped by and hoping toward this poetic vision of the New Creation as presented quite profoundly in Revelation 21.

As an Act Five staff and board, our hearts are shaped by this vision and we believe God is calling us to participate in the coming of this vision even now. It guides our decision-making and programming - on canoe trips, on Manitoulin Island, in our public learning spaces, in shared meals with our refugee neighbours, and more.

At the end of the 2024-25 program year, one student wrote the following in this final assignment:

"The Lord is making everything new. ... We are given a vision of renewal, of restoration, and of justice. A vision where all who are thirsty come to the table and drink the water of life. A vision where God's dwelling, God's tabernacle is with the people and the people make space for God."



We hope and expect that God can do greater things than we can imagine. While we acknowledge the reality of suffering, we hope and wait on the resurrected Lord, practicing resurrection life as we build communities, plant gardens and sing new songs.

#### Testimony from Phil Hosmar,

Teacher at London Christian High

"When [our] Capstone course launched in September of 2022, we felt there needed to be something to jumpstart the learning experiences for the students. I had heard about other schools partnering with Act Five on what was called a 'Serve & Observe' trip in Hamilton...[Now], we are in year three and trip five connecting with Act Five and the experience has always been the same. We are welcomed when we arrive and are encouraged

to notice the beauty and brokenness that exist all around us, but to also see God's image in those we encounter. We have enjoyed spaghetti dinners, community walks and time at 75 Blake St., and been connected with agencies who care for their community as Jesus commanded; to feed the hungry, clothe the naked and care for the widow and orphan. Students often refer to this trip as the highlight of the Capstone course and of their year. We pray it continues for years to come as they speak into the lives of high school students and do God's work in the city of Hamilton."



In January 2025, Act Five launched a long-awaited project to purchase and renovate the Act Five home.

With ownership as of May 2025, Act Five has begun a series of needed renovations to make this home a place of hospitality, refuge, and formation for emerging young adults.
